The following information from the Registry of the International Court of Justice has been communicated to the Press:

The International Court of Justice held two public sittings to-day,
April 13th, 1951, in the case concerning the Reservations to the
Convention on Genocide.

The Attorney General of the United Kingdom, Sir Hartley Shawcross, stated the views of the British Government on the question.

To-morrow, Mr. G. G. Fitzmaurice, Second Legal Adviser to the Foreign Office, will terminate the United Kingdom statement and Professor Rousseau will then make a statement on behalf of the French Government.
