




RADA DE ARICA 1994






INITIAL SECTOR OF THE LAND BOUNDARY AS DEFINED BY THE 1929 TREATY



EL ESPACIO GEOGRÁFICO CHILENO

Chilean National Atlas: 2005

El territorio de Chile se encuentra definido y delimitado por fronteras con un total de 6.630 km de longitud, de los que 190 km comparte con Perú, 850 km con Bolivia y 5.600 km con Argentina.

En su extensión sudamericana, Chile es el país más largo y angosto del mundo; proporcionalmente es también el que tiene mayores espacios marítimos y aéreos.

En su sentido geográfico, su soberanía se distribuye en un trapezoidal cuyas bases tocan con el Perú (en el límite norte), con Bolivia y Argentina (en el este), la Isla de Pascua (en el oeste) y el Polo Sur. Este gran espacio terrestre, con sus correspondientes espacios marítimos y aéreos, descontando la soberanía incluida en él, es lo que se entiende por territorio nacional.

El territorio sudamericano, con una superficie de 753.726 km², presenta rasgos geográficos que le otorgan un carácter de bisimilitud, presentándose por el norte con extensas zonas áridas y deserticas; en el sur se encuentra el paso Drake, que une los océanos Atlántico y Pacífico; al este se alza la cordillera de los Andes, que hacia el sur es reemplazada por la aridez de la pampa, y en el oeste se extiende la vicedesota del océano Pacífico. Sumado a lo anterior, conforman también el territorio de Chile las islas oceanicas y el Territorio Chileno Antártico.

En relación con el territorio insular, este se encuentra constituido por varias islas del océano Pacífico: el archipiélago Juan Fernández (a 360 millas náuticas o 667 km del continente); las islas San Félix y San Ambrosio (a 500 millas náuticas o 926 km); la isla Salas y Gómez (aún más alejada a 1.870 millas náuticas o 3.463 km) y, finalmente, Isla de Pascua o Rapa Nui (a 2.000 millas náuticas o 3.700 km). Estas dos últimas permiten ampliar el territorio marítimo de Chile de 200 a 350 millas náuticas, es decir, que el total del lecho marítimo es de 4.638.615 km², superando en poco más de seis veces la extensión de su territorio continental sudamericano.

Al sur del paso Drake y más allá del continente sudamericano se encuentra el Territorio Chileno Antártico, conformado por un triángulo estéril que se proyecta hasta el mismo Polo Sur entre los meridianos 53° y 90° oeste, con una superficie aproximada de 1.250.000 km² (Decreto Supremo 1.747, de 6 de noviembre de 1940).


