Application of the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide in Sudan (Sudan v. United Arab Emirates)

Serbia files a declaration of intervention in the proceedings under Article 63 of the Statute

THE HAGUE, 25 April 2025. Yesterday, Serbia, invoking Article 63 of the [Statute](#) of the Court, filed in the Registry of the Court a declaration of intervention in the case concerning *Application of the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide in Sudan (Sudan v. United Arab Emirates)*.

Pursuant to Article 63 of the Statute, whenever the construction of a convention to which States other than those concerned in the case are parties is in question, each of these States has the right to intervene in the proceedings. In this case, the construction given by the judgment of the Court will be equally binding upon them.

In accordance with Article 83 of the [Rules](#) of Court, Sudan and the United Arab Emirates have been invited to furnish written observations on the declaration of intervention.

History of the proceedings

On 5 March 2025, Sudan filed an [Application instituting proceedings](#) against the United Arab Emirates concerning alleged violations by the latter of its obligations under the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide (the "Genocide Convention") in relation to the Masalit group in Sudan, most notably in West Darfur.

The Application was accompanied by a [request for the indication of provisional measures](#) submitted pursuant to Article 41 of the Statute of the Court and Articles 73 to 75 of the Rules of Court. Public hearings on Sudan's request were held on Thursday 10 April 2025.

The International Court of Justice (ICJ) is the principal judicial organ of the United Nations. It was established by the United Nations Charter in June 1945 and began its activities in April 1946. The Court is composed of 15 judges elected for a nine-year term by the General Assembly and the Security Council of the United Nations. The seat of the Court is at the Peace Palace in The Hague (Netherlands). The Court has a twofold role: first, to settle, in accordance with international law, legal disputes submitted to it by States; and, second, to give advisory opinions on legal questions referred to it by duly authorized United Nations organs and agencies of the system.
