

Communiqué 60/6 (Unofficial)

The following information from the Registry of the International Court of Justice is communicated to the Press:

At the hearings opening on Tuesday, 26 April 1960, in the matter of the Constitution of the Maritime Safety Committee (Request for Advisory Opinion), the States participating in the oral proceedings have indicated that they would be represented by the following:
