The following information from the Registry of the International Court of Justice has been communicated to the Press:

The International Court of Justice to-day (Thursday, September 27th, 1951) held two sittings, during the course of which the oral proceedings in the Fisheries case (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland v. Norway) were continued.

Sir Bric Beckett, Agent for the United Kingdom, concluded his argument in support of the British case.

The Attorney-General, Sir Frank Soskice, K.C., will address the Court to-morrow (Friday, September 28th) at the public hearing beginning at 10.30 a.m., when he will continue the argument in support of the British case.
