Aegean Sea Continental Shelf

Closure of Ocal Proceedings

The following information is made available to the press by the Registry of the International Court of Justice:

At public sittings on 9, 10, 11, 12, 15, 16 and 17 October 1978 the Court heard oral argument on the question of its jurisdiction in the Aegean Sea Continental Shelf case (Greece v. Turkey), presented on behalf of the Government of Greece by Ambassador Konstantopoulos, as Agent of Greece, Mr. Economides, as Agent, advocate and counsel, and Mr. Evrigenis and Professors O'Connell, De Visscher, Weil and Pinto, as advocates and counsel.

During these hearings, questions were put by the Fresident, both on the Court's and on his own behalf, and by Judges Gros, Dillard, Sir Humphrey Waldock and Mosler. The Court also requested further explanations with regard to one of the documents deposited by Greece.
